1. Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 pm.

4. Presentation – Ride Hailing

Justin Hall provided a presentation on Managing Ride-hailing on the North Shore. Some of the key highlights were as follows:

- Transportation, Bylaws, and Legal staff are working together with the North Shore municipalities to ensure an efficient system to support and manage ride-hailing, within the limits to municipal authority the province has set out.
- Under the new legislation and regulations, the Province introduced new terminology to
 describe the types of business that fall under the umbrella term "passenger directed
 vehicles", or PDVs. Under this framework, ride-hailing exists as a type of passenger
 directed vehicle much like taxis and limousines, and the companies delivering ridehailing are known as transportation network services.

- Proposed North Shore Framework Key Principals
 - Enhance mobility options
 - Build foundation for future policy
 - Consistency across boundaries
 - Work within organizational capacity
 - Communicate with transparent approach

Objectives to Meet

- Minimize congestion
- Maintain affordability for passengers & companies
- Minimize burden to municipal resources
- Increase accessibility
- Maximize safety
- Reduce GHG emissions within the limitations set by the province
- Proposed Street & Curb Management Actions
 - Create consistent loading zone definitions for North Shore municipalities
 - Create geofenced areas to restrict access or designate reserved loading zones + work with companies to implement
 - CNV and DNV will create a new Congestion and Curbside Management Permit with pick-up & drop-off charges during peak times that are discounted for ZEV & waived for accessible vehicles
 - Use revenues to fund transportation investments like active and accessible transportation
 - Execute actions after receiving & analyzing data to demonstrate need
- Next Steps
 - Bring bylaw changes to Council in March 2020
 - Develop success metrics and key performance indicators
 - Monitor ride-hailing data to optimize road space allocation and address impacts to vulnerable groups

8. Subcommittee Reports

8.1. Transportation & Mobility (Maeve)

Horseshoe Bay Streetscape

Members reviewed the Horsehoe Bay Streetscape report as prepared by the Transportation & Mobility subcommittee, and no issues were raised during the review.

ACDI is pleased to have consulted on the Horseshoe Bay Streetscape for a second time. The use of concrete for the sidewalk is an exciting use of universal design that will benefit all. There is concern on the removal of a key design feature, the full curb separating the bike lane from the sidewalk, which would have provided safety for all pedestrians. The Committee urges the project proponents to adopt the recommendations listed above, which will improve the overall accessibility of the project. The ACDI requests a response/update regarding the recommendations within 60 days.
