



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Decommissioning In-ground Concrete Pools

- 1. A Request for service case is created including the site specifics, requestor name and contact information.
- 2. An inspection is assigned to the Building Inspector for that area.
- 3. Structural and /or Geotechnical Engineers may be required if the pool is located on or near a steep slope, is near a stream or waterfront, or is structurally integrated into the principal building.
- 4. The concrete liner must have holes knocked through it to provide for adequate drainage and prevent saturation of the backfill material.
- 5. The Environmental Department requires a standard letter to be signed by the owner on title, stating that only clean non-toxic sand or gravel be used to backfill the pool. The old concrete pool apron may be placed in the backfill as well.
- 6. Contact the DNV Mechanical Inspector for requirements to disconnect heating and pumping equipment and disconnect from the supply and sanitary.
- 7. Contact the DNV Electrical Inspector for requirements to disconnect electrical service to the pool for lighting and heating and pumping equipment.



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
